Dame Beryl Grey has had a fascinating career, as one of our leading Ballerinas. She was Britain's first Ballerina, at the tender age of 14, joining the Sadler's Wells Ballet, now known as the Royal Ballet. Dame Beryl steadily progressed to Principal Ballerina.

In 1942 Robert Helpmann created the first role for her entitled "The Birds", where she performed the Nightingale.

She was the first western Ballerina to be invited to dance with the Bolshoi Ballet in Moscow and the fledgling Peking Ballet in China, something that was not heard of from an English Ballerina, dancing behind the Iron and Bamboo curtain.
